


The Post

Steven Spielberg directs a film about the Pentagon Papers controversy. The story will follow the 1971 scandal after the decision of The Washington Post editor Ben Bradlee (Tom Hanks) and publisher Katharine Graham (Meryl Streep) to publish The Pentagon Papers. Written and leaked by military analyst Daniel Ellsberg, the Pen-

tagon Papers established that the Johnson Administration had lied to the public and congress about US military involvement in the Vietnam War, and revealed that the Nixon administration had secretly escalated the war. The Nixon administration tried to stop The Post from publishing them, and Assistant U.S. Attorney General William Rehnquist took the case to the Supreme Court, which ruled in favor of the paper.

answers to the questions the Gladers have been asking since they first arrived in the maze.


